your students understand what to expect on PreACT and how to use resources do their best.

encourage

students to use practice resources before testing

- Help students create an **ACT Academy** account to use the free online learning tool and practice test program.
- Have students use the lessons, practice questions and tests, and games during class, study periods, and at home to improve skills.
- Have staff use available **ACT[®] sample items** and questions in the classroom as a warm-up activity for the actual PreACT test.

explain

what students can expect with PreACT

Students provide important information about themselves and their interests and plans:

- Their answers give clues to what they want to do in the future and identifies jobs they might like to pursue.
- They have the option to connect with colleges and scholarship agencies.

Students take four subject area tests:

- English – 30 minutes
- Math – 40 minutes
- Reading – 30 minutes
- Science – 30 minutes

Remind students to relax on test day —PreACT measures information they are already learning in class every day!



remind

students of test-taking strategies for success

- Follow directions exactly, and don't be afraid to ask questions.
- Don't spend too much time on any single question. For difficult ones, choose the best answer and move on.
- If you complete a test before time is called, recheck your work.
