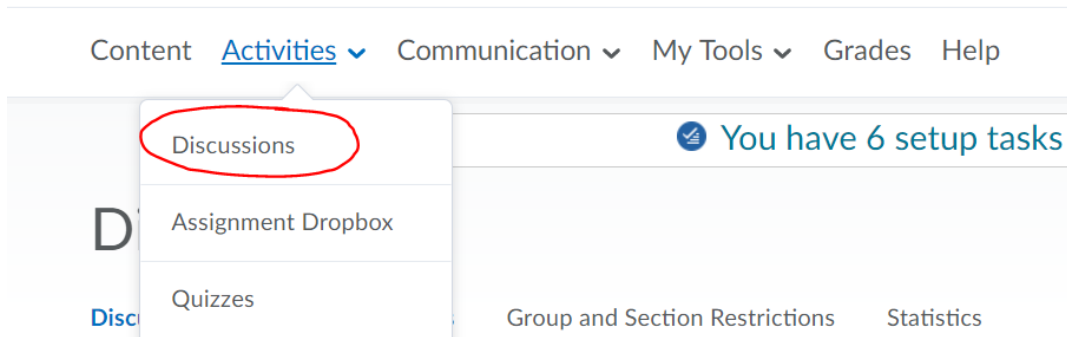


Grading a Discussion Assignment


